San Diego, CA - With more than 300 days of sun every year, renowned surf spots like Del Mar and La Jolla, and a bustling culinary and craft beer scene, San Diego is a surfer's paradise and a feast for foodies. Explore distinct neighborhoods and enjoy the city’s laid-back charm on cruises to San Diego, California.

Puerto Vallarta- squeezed into the thin space between Banderas Bay and the verdant folds of the Sierra Madre. It still retains the essence of the fishing village it once was. Viejo Vallarta, the old town, is a mix of red-tiled buildings, cobble streets, chic shops and busy open markets.



Huatulco, Mexico - Situated on Mexico’s Pacific Coast in the state of Oaxaca, has nine bays and 36 beaches, offering more than enough opportunities for fun in the sun. There are also archaeological sites to explore, rivers to raft, and waterfalls. Bird lovers, will find Huatulco to be especially captivating, as it is home to more than 225 species, including many rare ones and a number that are endemic to Mexico, like the Colima pygmy owl.

Puerto Chiapas. Mexico - The town of Puerto Chiapas is a jumping-off point to explore surrounding areas,

including Tapachula, the second-largest city in the state of Chiapas. In addition to visiting the coffee estates and banana and cacao plantations of the area, day trips include excursions to Maya sites such as Izapa. Although not as well known as some of the Maya sites of southern and eastern Mexico, such as the UNESCO World Heritage Site Chichén Itzá, Izapa is impressive nonetheless. In addition to its interesting location—it sits along a river and is aligned with a volcano (the sixth-tallest mountain in Mexico)—archaeologists have found numerous stelae and evidence that it was the largest Maya site in Chiapas.

Puerto Quetzal, Guatemala - Modernity meets Maya in Puerto Quetzal, where weavers spin their brilliantly colored stories on backstrap looms while the harbor handles Panamax-sized cargo vessels. This is the largest port on the Pacific Ocean side of this Central American country, important for both cargo and cruise ships. Puerto Quetzal is an ideal point of departure for exploring Guatemala's stunning, volcano-studded landscape, or one of the country's Maya sites, the UNESCO-recognized colonial city of Antigua, or a coffee plantation.

Fuerte Amador, Panama - Located west of Panama City at the Pacific entrance to the Panama Canal, Fuerte Amador is a gateway to exploring the many faces of this unique Central American country. The impressive engineering of the canal itself is a wonder to behold; a quick trip to the Miraflores Locks' visitor center with its panoramic observation decks offers the chance to watch behemoth barges thread their way through the legendary manmade waterway.

Panama Canal - Marvel as your ship is lifted 85 feet from the Caribbean to Gatún Lake then gently lowered to the Pacific, using no power other than the force of gravity. Truly one of life's great travel thrills.

Cartagena, Colombia - Following two days at sea visit Cartagena, once a bastion of the Spanish Main and boasting colonial architecture and the finest emeralds in the world. Spain poured millions into the port's defense, building the fortifications that are today a UNESCO World Heritage Site. You can walk those deeply textured alleyways today through some of the best-preserved colonial neighborhoods of the Americas. When you're ready for a change, there are beaches ready. Bocagrande is busy and close to the city. Playa Blanca is south across the bay and quieter.

Half Moon Cay, Bahamas - a crescent-shaped private island offers white-sand beaches, a turquoise lagoon and untouched nature. Renowned for its beauty and amenities, it's a highlight for the one who are seeking tranquility or adventure. Activities range from snorkeling and kayaking to simply relaxing on the beach, making it a perfect Caribbean retreat.
