1 We depart Bismarck this morning with pickup in route along I 94 to Fargo. Traveling through Minnesota our senses will marvel as the back drop of the season surrounds our deluxe motorcoach. Our travels take us to the city of Ashland, WI where we find our lodging for the night.

2 We travel across Michigan, crossing the straits of Mackinac with Lake Michigan on one side and Lake Huron on the other. We enjoy the color of Fall leaves as we make our way across the lower arm of the upper Peninsula of Michigan and enjoy the wonder and beauty of Lake Michigan as we travel to Mackinaw City where we will overnight.

3 This morning we board Shepler’s Ferry for our transport to charming Mackinac Island. Since motor vehicles are not permitted to intrude on the natural beauty of Mackinac Island, there is no better way to visit this historic isle and see the legendary points of interest than by carriage. Our Carriage Tour will be expertly narrated, and we will travel in comfortable charming carriages “with the fringe on top.” After allowing some time for lunch and shopping we continue our journey South through country side that is known for colorful Fall Foliage. Our destination today is the unique town of Frankenmuth, Michigan and our overnight lodging. Settled in the mid 1880's by Franconians from Germany who came as Lutheran missionaries, this picturesque town still retains an Old World atmosphere. Following dinner on your own, we make our way to Bronner’s CHRISTmas Wonderland.

4 We continue our journey and make our way to beautiful Niagara Falls, Ontario. A step-on-guide boards our motorcoach for a city tour of Niagara Falls. We then check into our lodging. Niagara at night is something that cannot be described but must be experienced, and this evening we encounter these Night Illuminations. We observe this kaleidoscope of colors from Skylon Tower.

5 Our journey takes us across the state of New York and into Vermont, where we enjoy the fall colors as we travel. This afternoon, we travel through the beautiful Berkshire mountains, where Norman Rockwell spent the last 25 years of his life. We stop at Quechee Gorge, Vermont’s little Grand Canyon”. We find our overnight lodging in this unique New England area.

6 We are off to explore New Hampshire and the fabulous White Mountains. Formed 200 million years ago, the Flume Gorge and Cannon Mountain are at the center of Franconia Notch and are still two of New England’s most popular and intriguing natural geological wonders. Their Visitor’s center is a wonderful place to learn about this area. At the Basin we enjoy a gentle walk to view the “Old Man’s Foot”, a natural granite pothole at the base of the waterfalls. Enjoy the salty scent in the air today as we travel along the rugged, rock-bound coast to Kennebunkport, a resort town where the Bush family has their summer home out on Walker’s Point. This seaside town offers

white sand beaches, rocky shorelines, and salt marshes. Novelists Kenneth Roberts and Booth Tarkington lived and worked here. We will enjoy a trolley tour and stroll the streets of this town before traveling the coast South to Boston, Massachusetts.

We find our overnight lodging in this great city.

7 Today we spend the day on a guided tour of Boston, a ‘City Upon the Hill.’ New England’s major port, Boston, began with John Winthrop and his colonists in 1630, and has been the capital of Massachusetts since 1632. Our day will include a visit to Quincy Market, Old North Church, and the USS Constitution, Old Ironsides. We continue to Plymouth, Massachusetts. Since the landing on Plymouth Rock in 1620, Plymouth, has grown into a panorama of Pilgrim and colonial times. You can visit The Mayflower II, a reproduction of the original 17<sup>th</sup> century vessel that Alan Villiers sailed over from England in 1957. Continuing on to ‘Old Cape Cod’, we settle into our lodging in Hyannis for the next two evenings on Cape Cod.

8 We catch a ferry to the famous Island of Martha’s Vineyard in Nantucket Sound. Following our ferry crossing, we have a guided tour of Martha’s Vineyard, famous as a summer resort used by the rich and famous. We begin our Island tour in Oak Bluffs, strolling amidst the colorful Victorian Gingerbread Cottages. In the afternoon we explore Edgartown an old whaling port, before returning to the ferry terminal to prepare for our voyage back to the mainland. Our day will be complete with a traditional Lobster dinner this evening.



9 We journey to Newport, Rhode Island this morning, where we tour the city’s Ten Mile Drive and view the famous mansions. We have lunch on our own and then head to New York. The ‘Big Apple’ is the nation’s most populous city, the country’s leading port, and is also its financial, business, and cultural center. The Broadway Theater District is a compact area that houses nearly 40 theaters that showcase American drama and musical theater. This evening we have the option of attending a Broadway Play (TBD). We

find our lodging in Secaucus, New Jersey for the next two nights.

10 We visit Ellis Island, the major processing station for immigrants between 1892 and 1954, at the head of New York City’s Upper Harbor. After visiting this landmark, we have a better perspective of those who have found refuge here. The Statue of Liberty has symbolized America’s welcome for more than one hundred years. This afternoon we tour the 911 Memorial & Museum. A local step-on-guide will help us discover the innumerable points of interest in this very contemporary city, New York. We see one of New York’s most recognizable landmarks, including the sites of Broadway, the Empire State Building, and Rockefeller Center.



11 We arrive in our nation’s Capitol, Washington, D.C. where federal government is its primary industry. This afternoon, time will be allowed to explore the 14 museums that make up the Smithsonian Institute. Some of the museums included in your Smithsonian visit could be; National Air & Space Museum, National History Museum , or Holocaust Museum. We will take in an Illuminated tour of some of the monuments. A visit to the Kennedy Center, the independent privately supported national performing arts center is a must. We will be staying two nights in Washington, D.C.

12 We begin our day on board a shuttle at Arlington Cemetery, we make stops at the Tombs of the Unknown Soldiers, the Kennedy grave sites, and Arlington House. After Arlington we will head over and tour the National Cathedral. This afternoon we will have a guided tour of D.C. to include; the Franklin D. Roosevelt

Memorial, the Lincoln Memorial, the Washington Monument, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, and Fords Theatre. Following our tour we head over to Arlington.

13 A visit to the New England States would not be complete without a tour of Mount Vernon. This mansion located on the shores of the Potomac River is the home of George & Martha Washington. The site of this 18<sup>th</sup> century plantation includes the mansion, a museum, 30 acres of gardens and grounds, and the tomb of its famous owners. Upon departing Mount Vernon, we make our way to Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. Arriving in Gettysburg this afternoon, we take an interesting tour of Gettysburg National Park. This historic battlefield is where the conflict of the Civil War occurred.

14 On our way to our overnight destination in Freemont, IN we will make a stop at Flight 93. We continue to view the colorful countryside as we enjoy the company of our traveling companions.

15 We start traveling westward where our days end finds us in Chippewa Falls, where we will find our lodging. This evening we gather for our farewell dinner.

16 This morning we sit back and remember all the wonderful sights and attractions that we have experienced these past days. With the magic of the Cape and the beauty of the New England states in foliage splendor behind us, we look forward to our next excursion with Judy's Leisure Tours.
