<u>Fly to Montreal, Quebec, Canada:</u> Stay the night in Montreal and free night. The cultural capital of Canada, Montreal always seems to show up on "most livable city" lists and has been named a UNESCO City of Design. Cruise travelers can why along the historical streets of Old Montreal, Parc Jean-Drapeau (along the St. Lawrence River), and the cubist residential welter of Habitat 67. French is the first language of most residents.

Quebec City: Few places in North America are as steeped in history as Québec City, Canada. Older than Jamestown



and founded before the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock. The Québec City historic district, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is still home to religious orders and hospitals that date back to the 17th century. Its Place-Royale would look familiar to the explorer Samuel de Champlain, even with its modern attractions of gift shops and cafés. On the Plains of Abraham, you can walk the battlefield where, in 1759, the French forces under General Montcalm were decisively trounced by the British, led by General Wolfe.

More than 95 percent of Québec City's population speaks French as its first language, though it's easy to sightsee and navigate the city in English

<u>Baie-Comeau:</u> Beautifully located on the banks of the Mancouagan and Saint Lawrence Rivers. Stroll the lovely quartier Sainte-Amelie. Learn about regional wildlife at the Maison de la Faune. Or visit the new Centre Boreal, a fascinating Glacier Center where visitors can walk through a manmade glacier, experiencing its temperature, sound and movement.

<u>Havre-Saint-Pierre:</u> Located on the north shore of Quebec's Saint Lawrence River, Havre-Saint-Pierre offers panoramic views and miles of sandy beaches. It is the gateway to the Mingan Archipelago National Park Reserve, home to abundant wildlife a limestone monoliths, sculpted over the millennia by the elements.

<u>Corner Brook:</u> A small but bustling city, is on Newfoundland's west coast. Captain Cook initially mapped this area, known as the Bay of Islands, in 1767, and like many other Newfoundland settlements, Corner Brook started out as a fishing village. Later, one of the largest pulp and paper mills in the world was built here.

St Anthony: Near the northern tip of Newfoundland's Great Northern Peninsula, tiny St. Anthony predates even the famed navigator and explorer Jacques Cartier. St. Antony's fortunes are tied to the sea, fishermen were followed by whalers, and now tourism has become important with whale-watching expeditions a principal draw.

<u>St Johns:</u> The capital of Newfoundland, St. John has long looked east and across the Atlantic. It is the easternmost city in North America, excluding Greenland, and has it own time zone, a half-hour ahead of the rest of Eastern Canada. The harbor remains the center of the city with its oldest buildings and streets nearby.

<u>Halifax:</u> It's big enough to be the economic and cultural capital of eastern Canada, but small enough to be easygoing and hospitable. Halifax residents have it good, the city is located on one of the planet's great natural harbors and adorned with landmarks like the Citadel fortress, Pier 21 (Canada's Ellis Island), and the Maritime Museum of the Atlantic. Outside the city, visitors can discover the weather beaten landscape of Nova Scotia's south shore. See craggy coastlines, the boulder red topography of Peggy's Cove, and the German village of Lunenburg, so meticulously restored it has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

<u>Bar Harbor:</u> For much of the year, sunlight touches the United States first at Cadillac Mountain on the Maine Coast. From the granite-slabbed summit, light tiptoes down across the rest of Mount Desert Isle, Acadia National Park, the town of Bar Harbor and then the rest of the country. The raw coastal scenery attracted Hudson River School painters in the 1840s, and their art in turn lured visitors to the area. Lots of them. Before you know it, Bar Harbor was a haven for the East Coast glittering class and bejeweled with grand mansions and immaculate gardens. Cruise visitors can walk the streets of town, relax on the Village Green, or climb Cadillac Mountain. You'll see that the grandeur abides.

Boston, Massachusetts: Arrive in Boston and be transferred to Airport.
