Day 1, Tuesday, September 23: We travel across Minnesota and Wisconsin as we depart for one of mid-America's premier



vacation destinations **Door County**. Often called the "Cape Cod of the Midwest," the Door Peninsula is a scenic wonderland. We hope to enjoy the **fall colors** as we make our way to **Door County**, where we find our lodging for the next three nights in **Sister Bay**, **WI** at the **Leatham Smith Lodge**. We will have an **included Dinner** at the lodge.

Day 2, Wednesday, September 24: A local guide will join us today. We will board a ferry to Washington Island and learn how the Islanders live. Our first stop is Washington Harbor/Schoolhouse Beach. It is one of five beaches in the world like it and is a part of the Niagara Escarpment. A protected harbor area and the Island's original shipping port. Next, we head over to Farm Museum. Where they have Farm buildings from various locations on the Island were moved here and reassembled on our 20 acres. Housed in the nine buildings are collections of farm implements, old time tools and kitchen items. There is special emphasis on the period from 1870-1940. You will learn the history of Stave Church on the island. We will go up town for a stop at Mann's Mercantile to shop like the locals. After a day on the island we take the ferry back. A stop at Ephraim Lavender Shop. We will continue to Egg Harbor and make a stop at one of the greatest winery's the Door Peninsula Winery where you can do some tasting. Maybe even do some shopping of your favorite wines and cheeses. We end the day with an included dinner.

Day 3, Thursday, September 25: We will have a guide with us again today as we head to Cave Point Door County Park where the winds & waves from Lake Michigan have worn away limestone cliffs to create underwater caves. On some days the sound of waves crashing into the cliffs is thunderous, and the spray can shoot up to 20 feet in the air. The view from the top is breathtaking as you watch the water splash and swirl beneath you. We will head over to Dan Meunier School House. Dan is a



composer, singer and storyteller, he holds **concerts** in his historic schoolhouse which doubles as a museum. The schoolhouse is filled with works of art and eclectic antiquities and has become a place for Dan to share his love of the creative spirit. Enjoy a special **concert** of old-time music, comedy and hymns that is sure to please! Dan performs from a grand piano, and upright piano, and from an antique parlor organ A "Taste of Door County" at the **Koepsel's Farm Market**, to sample Wisconsin's Famous Cheddars, homemade jams, jellies, relishes and dried-chocolate covered cherries. We then have an included **lunch** before we then drive through **Peninsula State Park**, Wisconsin's largest State Park and experience the beauty of the shores and bluffs on our way to the historic **Eagle Bluff Lighthouse**. The lighthouse was built in 1868 and furnished from that era, perched on a bluff 76 feet above the Green Bay waters we find the 151year old Lighthouse, whose lamp has remained constant for the past 151 years. We then will have time for some shopping in **Fish Creek** before we enjoy a tasty **Fish Boil dinner at Pelletier's**.

Day 4, Friday, September 26: As we make our way through the rolling hills of Wisconsin and the rich farmland of Minnesota, we reminisce about our experiences. The memories of our time spent together will stay with us for years to come.
